

It's now UCSI University

UNIVERSITY College Sedaya International is now officially a full-fledged University. UCSI recently received its university status from the Ministry of Higher Education and will henceforth be named UCSI University.

"This new status confirms that we have exceeded expectations. The conferment of university status to UCSI is testimony of the high quality of education and commitment to service excellence of all UCSI staff - both academic and administrative," said Chancellor Tan Sri Datuk Seri Panglima Dr Abdul Rahman Arshad.

Abdul Rahman pointed out that UCSI University's success also stems from the values it has always upheld: integrity, commitment, academic and organisational excellence, value innovation and life-long learning, giving its students the edge to win in a competitive world.

"Continuity of systems is another critical factor, which means evolving through incremental changes throughout the years to meet new needs, without destabilising the momentum of development.

"By providing world class facilities, able and knowledgeable lecturers, and other support systems, we are ensuring that our students are not only technically

competent, but are imbued with passion for personal development, and are fully equipped to chase their own dreams," Abdul Rahman said.

Founder, Group President and Vice Chancellor of UCSI, Peter T.S. Ng said in the past 22 years UCSI has continued to excel as a premier institution of higher learning.

"It has contributed much to the national private education landscape and even invested millions of ringgit to provide quality education in several states."

Ng said UCSI now has three separate campuses: one in Kuala Lumpur, one in Kuala Terengganu and another in Kuching, Sarawak. UCSI has also acquired 160 acres of land in the Negeri Sembilan "Knowledge Valley" at Bandar Springhill, which will be developed as its main campus.

This new complex will also house its corporate headquarters, an international school and a state-of-the-art 500 bed medical facility. It will also feature a centre dedicated to continuous research into Blue Ocean Strategy, an incubation centre for UCSI's subsidiaries and R&D spin-off companies, an applied nursery for research, and commercial facilities for the green industry to promote eco-tourism in



Malaysia and the inclusion of facilities for Marine Biology studies.

"Our commitment is to be a major player in the Malaysian economy, not only in the education sector, but also in generating foreign

income from non-education sectors," Ng said.

UCSI will be launching its new logo and re-branding campaign to make over its new corporate image in line with the new university status.
