

# 'Let's Have Fun' with Mapcu Sport

THE Malaysian Association of Private Colleges and Universities (Mapcu) 4<sup>th</sup> Sports Carnival organised by Taylor's College with the theme "Let's Have Fun" was launched at its campus last Monday.

Sixteen private institutions of higher learning will vie for honours. Eight sports will be contested over a 5-day period, on weekends beginning July 12.

The sports are athletics, 3 on 3 basketball, bowling, women's futsal, men's futsal, netball, road relay and tennis.

However, only 4 institutions - Taylor's, HELP University College, INTI College, Sunway University College will compete in all the sports.

Present at the launch were Mapcu president Dr Peter Ng, Programme Director of Taylor's School of Hospitality & Tourism, Neethiahnathan Ragavan and representatives of major sponsors including the nation's No.1 youth weekly, Malaysian Today.

Ng who is from University College Sedaya International commended Taylor's efforts for organizing the carnival and said that sport is indeed crucial in the lives of young people.

"There is no better place to teach the youths about the world than on the field of play.

"Competitions, more than winning and losing, will teach a person how to win with class and at the same time except defeat graciously," added Ng.
