The government had recently, as part of its economic stimulus plan, allowed Malaysians to apply for scholarships to pursue their postgraduate and doctorate degrees.

At UCSI University, students have a choice of four post-

graduate degree programmes.

The university offers a Master of Science in Biotechnology from the Faculty of Applied Sciences, a Master in Electrical Engineering from the Faculty of Engineering, Architecture and Built Environment, a Master in Logistics Management and a Master in Business Administration from the Faculty of Management and Information Technology.

All the postgraduate programmes run for three semesters except for the M. Sc. in Biotechnology which can be completed in four semesters.

President of academic affairs Professor Dr C.B. Lee said: "Our graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills required to become managers and lead researchers."

"Upon completion of their postgraduate degrees, they demonstrate professional competencies in one or more specialisations, evaluate and make decisions, employ ana-
