Students are given support in and out of classrooms to make sure they have the right experience to get jobs.

Students are coached on skills that will help them get through the first year of university.

These skills include writing workshops and research methods workshops that will ensure they can complete assignments and handle demanding subjects. One support programme is the Will Group (WG).

Students who find it hard to keep up with their lessons are never left behind. With WG, these students receive help from their peers and lecturers in a non-lecture setting.

Supporting teaching and learning at UCSI is the Centre for Learning Excellence, which promotes student-centred teaching and learning experience.

These skills are included in classroom assignments, ensuring that students understand and apply them.

Students are coached to improve their writing and presentation skills.

The centre also drives the Peer Assisted Study Session (PASS) programme where students work to consolidate understanding, reinforce key concepts and develop study strategies. Student leaders are trained by PASS supervisors. Students at UCSI undergo six to eight months of internship training at 600 partner companies.

Since the programme started in 2004, more than 3,000 students have been trained.

The true testimony of the success of the internship is that almost 90 per cent of the graduates are employed by the same company they interest with the flow reduction.
