

# UCSI University to hold road shows in Sarawak and Sabah

**SIBU:** UCSI University will be holding a series of road shows in Sarawak and Sabah at GES Global Education Group offices in Sibu, Kuching, Miri, Kota Kinabalu and Sandakan on July 13, 14, 15, 21 and 22 respectively from 1pm to 5pm.
